



Forthcoming judgments and decisions

The European Court of Human Rights will be notifying in writing two judgments on Tuesday 10 March 2026 and 57 judgments and / or decisions on Thursday 12 March 2026.

Tuesday 10 March 2026

[Manjani v. Albania \(application no. 32283/23\)](#)

The applicant, Shiqiri Manjani, is an Albanian national who was born in 1991 and lives in Pogradec (Albania).

In 2006, at the age of 15, Mr Manjari was convicted of theft and given a suspended sentence. The sentencing court noted that he posed a low degree of social danger and that the consequences of the criminal offence were minimal. According to a certificate from the General Directorate of Prisons (Ministry of Justice) dated 29 May 2017, he was considered legally rehabilitated.

The case concerns the refusal to admit Mr Manjani to the School of Magistrates in 2020 for training as a prosecutor owing to that spent conviction.

Relying on Article 8 (right to respect for private and family life) of the European Convention on Human Rights, Mr Manjani complains about the decision not to admit him to the School of Magistrates for training as a prosecutor on the basis of his conviction.

Thursday 12 March 2026

[Sekour v. France \(no. 52496/19\)](#)

The applicant, Sassim Sekour, is an Algerian national who was born in 1995. He was being detained in Beauvais Prison (France) when he lodged his application.

The case concerns the applicant's solitary confinement – after an initial charge of participation in a criminal conspiracy to commit an act of terrorism – and the successive decisions to prolong that measure.

Relying on Article 3 (prohibition of inhuman or degrading treatment) of the European Convention, the applicant submits that his prolonged solitary confinement amounted to inhuman and degrading treatment. He further complains of a violation of Article 8 (right to respect for private and family life) of the Convention, arguing that his isolation and its desocialising effect caused him suffering, and that his prolonged and unjustified solitary confinement deprived him of the possibility of leading a decent private life. Relying on Article 13 (right to an effective remedy), he also alleges that he had no effective remedy to challenge the decisions concerning his solitary confinement.
