

## Forthcoming judgments and decisions

The European Court of Human Rights will be notifying in writing 13 judgments on Tuesday 16 January 2024 and 165 judgments and / or decisions on Thursday 18 January 2024.

### Tuesday 16 January 2024

#### [Alkhatib and Others v. Greece \(application no. 3566/16\)](#)

The applicants, Douaa Alkhatib, Nourredin Tello and Lana Tello, are Syrian nationals who were born in 1991, 2011 and 2012 and live in Täby (Sweden).

The case concerns a serious gunshot wound suffered by a member of the applicants' family on 22 September 2014 near the island of Pserimos, when a boat was intercepted transporting people illegally to Greece.

Relying on Article 2 (right to life) of the European Convention on Human Rights, the applicants complain that the gunshot that seriously wounded their family member was not authorised under the relevant regulations and was neither absolutely necessary nor strictly proportionate to the aims pursued. They further complain of inadequate administrative and judicial inquiries into those responsible for the incident.

#### [Al-Hawsawi v. Lithuania \(no. 6383/17\)](#)

The applicant, Mustafa Ahmed Adam al-Hawsawi, is a national of Saudi Arabia who was born in 1968 and is currently detained in the internment facility at the United States Guantánamo Bay Naval Base in Cuba.

The case concerns the "extraordinary rendition" of Mr al-Hawsawi by the US Government during which he was allegedly held at a US Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) facility in Lithuania in 2005-06. He alleges torture, ill-treatment and unacknowledged, incommunicado detention. These alleged events took place against the background of the so-called "War on Terror".

Mr al-Hawsawi is currently on trial before a US military commission in Guantánamo Bay on suspicion of being a facilitator, financial manager and media-committee member of al-Qaeda.

He relies on Articles 2 (right to life), 3 (prohibition of inhuman or degrading treatment), 5 (right to liberty and security), 6 § 1 (right to a fair trial), 8 (right to respect for private and family life) and 13 (right to an effective remedy) of the European Convention and Article 1 of Protocol No. 6 (abolition of the death penalty) to the Convention.

#### [Rizzo and Others v. Malta \(no. 36318/21\)](#)

The applicants, Vincent John Rizzo, Philip Rizzo and Anne Farrugia, are Maltese nationals who were born in 1950, 1951 and 1954 respectively and live in Trecastagni (Mr Philip Rizzo) and Sliema (Malta).

The applicants together hold the perpetual *utile dominium* of a property in St Julian's. The case concerns the question of the effectiveness of an appeal to the Constitutional Court for the purposes of Article 13 following developments in domestic case-law in the ambit of judgments relating to old rent laws raising issues under Article 1 of Protocol No. 1 to the Convention.

Relying on Article 13 (right to an effective remedy) of the Convention and Article 1 of Protocol No. 1 (protection of property), the applicants complain that they do not have an effective remedy to protect their property rights, and that they are still victims of the violation of Article 1 of Protocol No. 1 found by the domestic courts given the low amount of compensation awarded by the first-instance court.

#### [Nafornița v. the Republic of Moldova \(no. 49066/12\)](#)

The applicants, Iurie Nafornița, Albina Nafornița, Alina Nafornița and Andrei Nafornița are Moldovan nationals who were born between 1968 and 1998 and live in Chișinău.

The case concerns the applicants' eviction from an apartment in which they had been living for 11 years and the court proceedings that followed.

Relying on Article 8 (right to respect for private and family life/home), Article 6 (right to a fair trial) and Article 1 of Protocol No. 1 (protection of property), the applicants complain, in particular, of their eviction.

Thursday 18 January 2024

#### [Ismayilzade v. Azerbaijan \(no. 17780/18\)](#)

The applicant, Leyla Miryagub gizi Ismayilzade, is an Azerbaijani national who was born in 1990 and lives in Baku.

The case concerns the refusal of the authorities to register the forename chosen by the applicant for her newborn child. She tried to register her son *Əbülfəzlabbas* (a Shia name) or variations on that name several times, but that was not allowed owing to the name not being on the approved list of the Azerbaijani National Sciences Academy, with the national courts also ruling that it would not be in the child's best interests owing to pronunciation issues.

Relying on Article 8 (right to respect for private and family life), the applicant complains of the refusal to register her chosen name for her son.

#### [Allée v. France \(no. 20725/20\)](#)

The applicant, Vanessa Allée, is a French national who was born in 1978 and lives in Courbevoie.

The case concerns the applicant's criminal conviction for public defamation following allegations she made of mental and sexual harassment and sexual assault by the executive vice-chair of the non-profit organisation where she worked. The claims were sent by email to six people from both inside and outside the organisation, with a copy to the vice-chair.

Relying on Article 10 (freedom of expression), the applicant complains that her criminal conviction for defamation has violated her right to freedom of expression.

#### [Dabo v. Sweden \(no. 12510/18\)](#)

The applicant, Abdelnaser Dabo, is a Syrian national who was born in 1961 and lives in Timmersdala (Sweden).

The case concerns legislation introduced in 2016 in Sweden requiring refugees granted asylum to prove they have sufficient income and accommodation in family-reunification requests if the application were lodged more than three months after the sponsor had been granted asylum. The applicant was granted asylum in March 2016, but his first wife and five children's applications for family reunification were refused because he could not fulfil this "maintenance" requirement.

Relying on Article 8 (right to respect for private and family life), the applicant complains that the Swedish authorities had applied the rules too rigidly when refusing to grant his first wife and five children residence permits, alleging that it would be impossible for most people to fulfil the maintenance requirement.

The Court will give its rulings in writing on the following cases, some of which concern issues which have already been submitted to the Court, including excessive length of proceedings.
