

## Judgments and decisions of 11 December 2025

The European Court of Human Rights has today notified in writing 28 judgments<sup>1</sup> and 59 decisions<sup>2</sup>: two Chamber judgments are summarised below;

separate press releases have been issued for two other Chamber judgments in the cases of *Intranuovo v. Italy* (application no. 46569/19) and *Nejjar v. Switzerland* (no. 9087/18);

a separate press release has also been issued for a decision in the case of *Fliegenschnee and Others v. Austria* (no. 40054/23);

### [Diacò and Lenchi v. Italy](#) (application nos. 15587/10, 32536/10, and 18531/14)\*

The applicants, Giuseppe Diacò and Maria Alessandra Lenchi, are Italian nationals who were born in 1972 and 1966 and live in Rome and Vigevano.

The case concerns the authorities' delayed payment of the applicants' fees for their work as lawyers.

Relying on Article 1 of Protocol No. 1 (protection of property) of the European Convention on Human Rights, the applicants complain about a delay in the payment of sums owed to them – as established in payment orders – in respect of legal-aid fees.

Under Article 6 § 1 (right to a fair hearing) and Article 13 (right to an effective remedy) of the European Convention, they also complain about the delayed payment of those sums and about the impossibility of having the payment orders enforced.

#### Violation of Article 1 of Protocol No. 1

##### Just satisfaction:

non-pecuniary damage: 7,200 euros (EUR) to Giuseppe Diacò and EUR 1,000 to Maria Alessandra Lenchi

### [Roşca v. the Republic of Moldova](#) (no. 60943/15)

The applicant, Aliona Roşca, is a Moldovan national who was born in 1977 and lives in Chişinău.

<sup>1</sup> Under Articles 43 and 44 of the Convention, Chamber judgments are not final. During the three-month period following a Chamber judgment's delivery, any party may request that the case be referred to the Grand Chamber of the Court. If such a request is made, a panel of five judges considers whether the case deserves further examination. In that event, the Grand Chamber will hear the case and deliver a final judgment. If the referral request is refused, the Chamber judgment will become final on that day. Under Article 28 of the Convention, judgments delivered by a Committee are final.

The case concerns the dismissal, in 2015, of a defamation claim brought by Ms Roşca, a former judge, following public accusations of professional misconduct by the President of the Superior Council of Magistrates.

Relying on Article 8 (right to respect for private life) of the Convention, the applicant complains that the domestic courts failed to provide sufficient reasons and to strike a fair balance when they dismissed her claim for the protection of her reputation.

### Violation of Article 8

#### Just satisfaction:

non-pecuniary damage: EUR 4,500

costs and expenses: EUR 820
